Keillor's 'Prairie' to stay in Minneapolis

MINNEAPOLIS — Garrison Keillor's "A Prairie Home Companion" won't be permanently leaving its St. Paul home after all.

The humorist said he expects to do about a dozen shows during the 2006-07 season from the Fitzgerald Theater, the long-time base of the public radio program.

The rest of the season's shows will air from the road, including a return to the Minnesota State Fair, he said. Keillor said last month that the show was looking for a new home. But in the end, he said, it was an impulsive decision to stay at the Fitzgerald, based partly on people he met at coffee shops or parties.

"They said it would be terrible if the show were not in St. Paul," Keillor told The Associated Press on Thursday. "I listen to people who tug at my sleeve."

its holiday break next month.

"There will be a love triangle for my character," Katherine Heigl, who plays Dr. Isobel "Izzie" Stevens on the hit ABC show, told reporters recently, according to AP Radio. The 27-year-old actress also

hinted about upcoming developments: "There's like some kind of prom episode or something. I don't know what that is. Somebody leaves the program."

But, she added: "I don't know what happens with Meredith and Dr. McDreamy. Nobody will tell

us yet what's going on there."

Ellen Pompeo stars as Dr. Meredith Grey, a first-year intern, and Patrick Dempsey plays neurosurgeon Derek Shepherd, nicknamed Dr. McDreamy. Meredith was getting cozy with Derek — until his sexy wife

showed up in Seattle.

"I love when people come up to me and tell me that they watch it. And ask like, 'Do you think Ellen and Patrick are going to get back together?'" Heigl said.

"I love that because we're working hard and it's great to know that that work is being appreciated."

"Grey's Anatomy" airs on Sunday nights (10 p.m.). The medical drama returns Jan. 8.

HONG KONG — Eva Herzigova says she wants to direct a movie about her Cinderella-like life, a Hong Kong magazine reports in its January issue.

The Czech supermodel, who shot to fame in the 1990s with the Miss Wonderbra ad campaign, talked about her directing ambitions in an interview with Prestige Hong Kong.

"I would like to direct a movie, but not a glossy feature film. I am thinking it would be more like a full-length documentary type of movie about my life," the 32-year-old Herzigova was quoted as saying.

"It would definitely be autobio-

graphical. It would be about a girl from the Eastern bloc who makes it in the fashion world. You know, a Cinderella story," she said.

Herzigova appeared in the 2004 film "Modigliani."

BURBANK, Calif. — Dick Clark, who suffered a stroke last December, won't be in a wheelchair when he appears on ABC's "New Year's Rockin' Eve" Saturday at 10 p.m., says co-host Ryan Seacrest.

It will be the 76-year-old Clark's first TV appearance since his stroke, which forced him to bow out of last year's show.

"I'm not a doctor and I'm not his wife so I don't see him on a daily basis, but he will not be in a wheelchair on the telecast," Seacrest told AP Radio in a recent interview.

Seacrest, who will make his debut as co-host of the New Year's Eve special, said Clark "has gotten better and better each day. I don't think he is a hundred percent but I think he's better than he was last week and better than he was six months ago."
