## Donor Adds \$12,000 to Poet Grant

An anonymous donor has contributed \$12,000 to match a federal grant which will enable 15 poets to come to Minneapolis to give readings and discussion for Minneapolis public school teachers and students.

Mrs. Robert E. Bowen, Minnetonka, who is the local project director, said the \$12,000 will be used to match a grant from the Academy of American Poets made by the federal government through the National Endowment for the Arts and Humanities.

A schedule has been set up for eight major poets to come here through May to give Saturday workshops for teachers at the University of Minnesota Museum of Natural History.

### Poets' Schedules

The poets and their schedules are Robert Bly, Jan. 27; Galway Kinnell, Feb. 10; Donald Hall, Feb. 24; Allen Tate, March 9; Louis Simpson, March 23; Denise Levertov, April 6; W. D. Snodgrass, April 20; May Swenson, May 4, and John Berryman, May 18.

The sessions will be moderated by local poets Roland Flint, University of Minnesota English instructor, and John Caddy, an instructor at University High School.

Flint, Caddy and five other young poets will go into junior and senior high classrooms to hold readings and discussions, Mrs. Bowen said. The five other poets are Garrison Keillor, Keith Gunderson, Peter Welter, Richard Shaw and June Meyer.

Mrs. Bowen said that the young poets will make more than 100 visits to schools and will visit some schools as many as three times. A selected few elementary schools also will be included in the visits.
