Keillor Coming Back

Garrison Keillor is returning to New York in May to do four of his weekly folksy "American Radio Company" broadcasts live from the 200-seat Lambs Theater on W. 44th St. Tickets, which go on sale early in April, are \$22 and \$26, with proceeds going to cover production costs. To reserve seats, call the box office at (212) 997-1780. Keillor is currently touring the country, with this weekend's show originating from Dallas. His guests are the **Dixie Chick** singing group and fiddler **Johnny Gimble**. Air times: tonight at 6 on WNYC-FM (93.9); tomorrow at 11 a.m. on WNYC-AM (820). Then, he's off to Chicago, Lexington, Ky., Memphis, Nashville and Milwaukee, returning to New York on May 4. This is the second season for "American Radio Company," a sequel to Keillor's famed "A Prairie Home Companion," which ran on public radio for 13 years. Keillor retired in June 1987 "to live the life of a shy person" but returned in November '89.
