Entertainers honor country music

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The legacy of country music is sacred, country music star Marty Stuart and radio host Garrison Keillor said at the groundbreak-

ing for the new home of the Country Music Hall of Fame.

"This is holy land," Stuart said Thursday, clutching a guitar used by the legendary "Singing Brakeman" Jimmie Rodgers.

The ceremony at the construction site of the \$37 million dollar museum and library opened with music by a "guitar marching band," and featured performances by Randy Scruggs, Bryan White, Kathy Mattea and Vince Gill. The 136,000-square-foot building is expected to open in 2001.

Keillor, who is helping raise money for the construction, led the audience in a standing ovation at the end of Gill's performance.
