Garrison Keillor to read from novel at Clapp Recital Hall

Garrison Keillor, one of public radio's most beloved personali-ties, will read from his new novel "Lake Wobegon Summer 1956" as part of WSUI's "Live from Prairie Lights" program Sept. 18. The reading will be at 8 p.m. at the Clapp Recital Hall and broad-

cast live on WSUI 910-AM. Keillor is best known as the host and writer of "A Prairie Home Companion" (broadcast at 5 p.m. Saturdays on KSUI-FM). Setting the novel in the fictional Lake Wobegon, Keillor captures post-war America and delivers a comedy about a kid coming of age as a writer in the rural Midwest.

Born in 1942 in Anoka, Minn., Keillor began his radio career as a student at the University of Minnesota. He later conceived "A Prairie Home Companion," first broadcast on July 6, 1974, in a St.

Paul, Minn., college theater in front of an audience of 12 people. Tickets for the reading are \$20 general admission and \$10 for stu-dents. Call the Hancher Box Office for information at 335-1160.
