Reilly as singing cowboys Lefty and Dusty. Tommy Lee Jones plays the Axeman who is dispatched by the radio station's new cor-

porate owners to shut down the show. An early 2006 release is planned.

In addition to his 40-year distinguished radio career, starting as a freshman at the University of Minnesota, Keillor is the author of 12 books, including "Lake Wobegon Days," "The Book of Guys," "The Old Man Who Loved Cheese," "Wobegon Boy," "Love Me," and "HomeGrown Democrat."

Keillor has received numerous honors throughout his career including a Grammy Award for his recording of "Lake Wobegon Days," as well as the recipient of two ACE Awards presented by the cable television industry, and is a member of the Radio Hall of Fame at the Museum of Broadcast Communications in Chicago.
