"Wobegon Boy," "Lake Wobegon Summer 1956" and now "Pontoon" extend the stories of the town, where all the men are strong, all the women good-looking and all the children above-average.

Keillor knows Dayton pretty well for a Minneso-ta boy: In 1997, he stopped by in support of "Wobegon Boy;" in 1998, Keillor and the Hopeful Gospel Quartet performed at Kettering's Fraze Pavilion; in June of 2002, he broadcast his radio show live from Fraze Pavilion and in October, he came back to hawk "Good Poems." All his bookctour stops have been at Books & Co. 's Town & Country location, but this time he'll be stationed at Books & Co. at The Greene

in Beavercreek, according to Sharon Kelly Roth, the store's director of public relations, who met Keillor 17 years ago.

"We won him in a contest back in 1990," she recalled.
"(Books & Co.) did a display of his book for a national contest, and he was the prize.

I got him back to his hotel at about 3 a.m. When you stand in front of him, he's yours for a while. He cemented himself in the hearts of Dayton that night." Roth said there will
