Garrison Keillor still set for Fort Tuthill Saturday

The Slide fire has not smoked out Garrison Keillor from the Pepsi Amphitheater at Fort Tuthill.

Cynthia Dunne, a spokeswoman for FleurCom Group, stated in an email that Keillor and his variety show "A Prairie Home Companion" will go on as planned Saturday and tickets are still available.

The amphitheater is located at Fort Tuthill, where 1,000 firefighters have been camped for the past week.

Keillor said he didn't have

anything specific about the Slide fire planned for his show, but he may add something now that he knows that no one was injured and no homes were lost.

"We'll certainly talk about it," he said.

Tickets are \$67.50 for reserved seats and \$47.50 for lawn seats. Gates open at 12:30 p.m. and the live broadcast of the show starts at 2:45 p.m.

The guest for this Saturday's show include singer/songwriter Colin Hay, better known as the lead singer from Men at Work,

the Australian group that produced the songs "Down Under" and "Who Can It Be Now?"

Also providing music for Saturday's show are Tex-mex rockers Los Texmaniacs and vocalist Lynn Peterson. KNAU Arizona Public Radio and R Entertainment are sponsoring the show.

A Prairie Home Companion is celebrating its 40th year of production. It is heard by 4 million listeners each week on more than 600 public radio stations.
