## Keillor to appear at Paterson church

PATERSON — Garrison Keillor, the popular Midwestern storyteller, is scheduled to perform at St. Paul's Episcopal Church Nov. 16 to raise money for the church's homeless men's shelter.

Irene Sterling, who is coordinating the event for the church, said details for the performance were worked out last week.

She said Keillor will give a 1½-hour talk at the church, which seats about 1,000. Tickets are expected to sell for \$15 and \$25.

"He's doing it because he is interested in the homeless," said Sterling.

Keillor reached national fame in the 1980s by authoring the best-seller "Lake Wobegon Days" and as the former host of American Public Radio's "A Prairie Home Companion."

He left the radio slightly more than a year ago and moved to Denmark. He has since moved to New York and has become active in the issue of homelessness.
