Garrison Keillor here Nov. 26


Garrison Keillor will return to Nashville Thanksgiving weekend for a Nov. 26 "Prairie Home Folk Song Show" at Vanderbilt University's Langford Auditorium, officials of Minnesota Public Radio announced yesterday.

Novelist/journalist/broadcaster Keillor has brought his *Prairie Home Companion* show to Nashville twice previously, in July 1985 and last May. His November appearance here will consist of performances at 2 p.m. and 7 p.m., the latter to be broadcast over the American Public Radio Network.

Nashville radio station WPLN-FM (90) will broadcast the 90-minute-plus evening show live, program director Cal Bean said yesterday.

The material to be featured on the November shows comes from A Prairie Home Companion Folk Song Book, a forthcoming Viking Press collection by Minnesotans John and Marcia Pancake. The tunes will include listener submissions of parodies, campfire songs and other old-time favorites.

Joining Keillor at Vanderbilt will

be star pickers Chet Atkins and Johnny Gimble, both regulars on the former *Prairie Home Companion* radio series. The Keillor-hosted series went off the air in June 1987, but still is heard in re-runs on more than 200 public radio stations.

In addition to his work in radio, Keillor is the author of two best-selling books, Lake Wobegon Days and Leaving Home.

Tickets for both Vanderbilt shows will cost \$10 and \$12 and will go on sale in about two weeks. ■
