Garrison Keillor will spin his tales — verbal escapades about a mythical land with all kinds of fascinating folk — in Dallas on Saturday.

show live from the Bronco Bowl. The program is heard locally on KERA/90.1 FM.

Keillor honed his storytelling style on A Prairie Home Companion, which made him and the mythical town of Lake Wobegon, Mich., household words during its 1984-87 run.

Saturday's two-hour performance will feature Keillor's Broadway Local Theater Company and the Coffee Club Orchestra, plus local musicians the Dixie Chicks and Grammy-win-

ning fiddler Johnny Gimble.

Keillor's show normally originates from Lamb's Theatre in New York. This will be his only Texas appearance with his variety show.

Garrison Keillor's American Radio Company performs at 5 p.m. Saturday at the Bronco Bowl, 2600 Fort Worth Ave., Dallas. Tickets to the show are \$21 for 90.1 members, \$26 for non-members.
