# **Keillor's booked at 5th Ave. library**

### **FOLKSY HUMORIST GARRISON**

Keillor's popular weekend radio show, "American Radio Company," keeps rolling along.

This week, his program will originate live from the New York Public Library on Fifth Ave. Locally, the show is heard on WNYC-FM (93.9) Saturdays at 6 p.m. and repeated on WNYC-AM (820) Sundays at 11 a.m.

Keillor jokes that the show will "blow the dust off the stacks." The two-hour broadcast will feature humorist and Pulitzer Prize winner Dave Barry and the doo-wop group 14 Carat Soul, singing "Who Wrote the Book of Love?"

Regulars Ivy Austin and Tom Keith will join Keillor and Barry in comedy sketches; Rob Fisher and the Coffee Club Orchestra will provide music, and Keillor will do his signature monologue, the News from Lake Wobegon.

Keillor plans to start the show on the Fifth Ave. steps of the library and then make his way to the third floor reading room, where the company, orchestra and guests will be.

Because of space limitations, the audience is "by invitation only," chosen from requests made by teachers, librarians and other literature aficionados.

Keillor's show, a sequel to his "A Prairie Home Companion," is aired over 230 stations nationwide by American Public Radio. — **George Maksian**
