

Keillor set for ABT

Garrison Keillor, creator of "A Prairie Home Companion" radio show and author of the best-selling book "Lake Wobegon Days," will perform at the Alberta Bair Theater in Billings on Friday, Aug. 28.

The performance will be a benefit for U.S. Rep. Pat Williams, D-Mont., who is challenging Rep. Ron Marlenee, R-Mont., for what will be Montana's lone congressional seat.

folksinger Jack Gladstone, Fromberg folk duo Curly and Kate, and the Montana Logging and Ballet Company, a musical and theatrical group that specializes in political satire.

Keillor created "A Prairie Home Companion" for Minnesota Public Radio, but it was soon picked up by National Public Radio and was heard around the country every Saturday.

Pam Egan, finance director for the Williams campaign, said Keillor is performing at the benefit in appreciation of Williams' support of National Public Radio and funding for the National Endowment for the Arts. She said he will also make a public appearance on Williams' behalf in Missoula on Saturday, Aug. 29.
