C> Keillor visits ... Garrison Keillor, creator of public radio's "A Prairie Home Companion" and author of "Lake Wobegon Days," will be in Missoula Saturday to plug the candidacy of Democratic Rep. Pat Williams for Montana's single seat in Congress. Keillor will speak at a 12:15 p.m. brunch at the Village Red Lion. The fund-raiser is sold out at \$30 a head, campaign workers said Friday. Williams gained Keillor's favor several years ago when the western district congressman worked to reauthorize the National Endowment for the Arts work that brought Williams considerable criticism from conservative groups. Keillor has been a familiar voice on radio since 1963; his popular Prairie Home Companion program ran on public radio from 1974 to 1987. He is the author of four books and has been a contributor to The New Yorker for many years. Keillor also appeared at a Friday night fund-raiser for Williams in Billings.
