NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Country music star Vince Gill surprised a national radio audience with a new duet partner — his 12-year-old daughter Jennifer.

The pair sang “Jenny Dreamed of Trains,” a song Gill wrote for Jennifer, on Garrison Keillor’s “A Prairie Home Companion” show, broadcast live Saturday night at the reopening of the historic Ryman Auditorium.

Jennifer has the right genes for the job: Her mother, Janis Gill, is half of the country act Sweethearts of the Rodeo. Vince Gill’s hits include “I Still Believe in You.”

The Ryman, home to the Grand Ole Opry from 1943-1974, reopened as a theater after undergoing \$8.5 million in improvements.
