Q. This past summer Garrison Keillor used to play a snappy little tune on his "Prairie Home Companion" program on KSJN radio. A. Try the classified ads in the newspaper and check around at stables and horse-sales barns listed in the telephone book's Yellow Pages. Also, saddle shops often post horses for sale on their bulletin boards. There aren't many burros around, so you'll have to look hard to find one.

I suggest that for riding you go to one of the larger ponies, P.O.A. (Ponies of America, Appaloosa color) or a Welsh-Arab cross, to a small horse, or another suitable-size pony breed. Burros and small ponies are stubborn, with a very rough gait to ride, and it's difficult to find a burro or small pony that is well-broken, because of their size. A person old enough to be knowledgeable of horses
