

Radio humorist to visit WKU campus next month

Radio humorist Garrison Keillor, whose show, "A Prairie Home Companion" is heard weekly on WKYU-FM Western Kentucky University's public radio service, will visit the campus Wednesday and Thursday, May 18 and 19.

Keillor, whose show is aired Saturdays from 5 to 7 p.m. through National Public Radio, will participate in a live broadcast from 8 to 10 a.m. each day and will be present at an open house at WKYU-FM from 1:30 - 3:30 p.m. on Wednesday.

"A Prairie Home Companion," set in the mythical town of Lake Wobegon, contains a mixture of satirical down-home humor and folk music performed by Keillor.

Keillor, a public radio disc jockey, got the idea for the show in 1974 while writing a story about the Grand Ole Opry for New Yorker magazine.

Keillor will also be the featured speaker at the Franklin-Simpson Chamber of Commerce dinner on May 18 at Franklin-Simpson High School.
