'A Prairie Home Companion' debuts on WBKY Saturday

WBKY-FM (91.3)

The Peabody Award-winning Saturday evening radio show, "A Prairie Home Companion," makes its central Kentucky debut this weekend, getting under way at 6 o'clock Saturday.

The contemporary radio variety show is broadcast live each week from the World Theater in St. Paul, Minn., and from nearby towns in the region when the show goes on tour.

Each program features a roster of musicians who play traditional jazz tunes, bluegrass, western swing, light opera, ethnic and old-time music.

There are also weekly reports from Lake Wobegon ("The little town that time forgot..."), home of such program "sponsors" as Powdermilk Biscuits, Jack's Auto Repair, the Sidetrack Tap and Bertha's Kitty Boutique.

"A Prairie Home Companion" was originated, is written and hosted by humorist Garrison Keillor, a native Minnesotan who has been an early morning show host on Minnesota Public Radio since the summer of 1966.
