Keillor and the "Prairie Home Companion" gang will appear at 7:30 tonight at the Madison Civic Center as part of WHA Radio's 65th anniversary observance, and this show, too, will be part of the marathon programming, beginning at 9:30 p.m. The regular broadcast show, ending at 7, will be followed by an in-depth inter-

view of Keillor by Studs Terkel. Joining him in the Madison show,

Joining him in the Madison show, which sold out in one day, will be the Butch Thompson Trio playing New Orleans style jazz, ragtime and old-time favorites; Peter Ostroushko, recently with the New Prairie Ramblers, with his fiddle and mandolin, and Stoney Lonesome's bluegrass band from Minnesota.

The show is sponsored by the Wisconsin Public Radio Association, which is launching a six-day membership drive today. The association, a
