

# HE'S BAAAAACK!

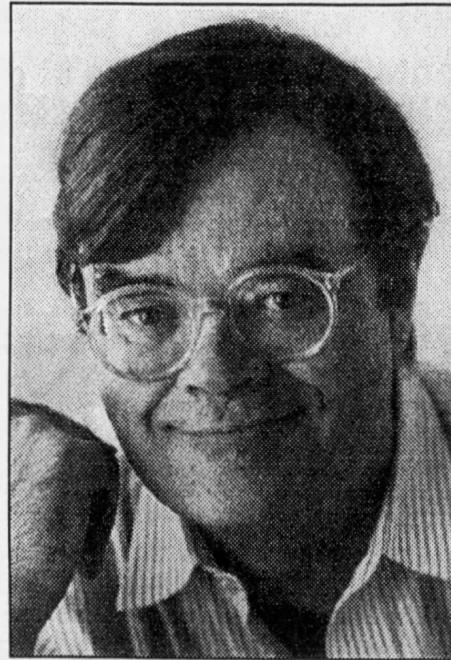
Garrison Keillor has launched a new radio project that will begin airing this quarter on KUFM/KGPR. **A Writer's Almanac** is five minutes of commentary and poetry by one of America's favorite humorists.

Keillor opens each show with brief notes about the day's literary landmarks — entertaining facts about the men and women of American literature. Then, accompanied by pianist Rob Fisher, Keillor recites a poem, bringing to it the same wit and warmth found in his Lake Wobegon monologues.

The poems reflect both Keillor's interest in promoting reading and writing and his belief that a serious poem is not necessarily a solemn one. The authors he chooses are evidence of his eclectic tastes. They include Emily Dickinson, Carl Sandburg and George Ade, whose biting **R-E-M-O-R-S-E** is a perfect work for the morning after New Year's Eve.

Helping to select poems for **A Writer's Almanac** is Peter Stitt, editor of the Gettysburg Review and interviewer of poets for the Paris Review, as well as author of several critical books on American poetry.

Keillor refers to his new program as the "Poem a Day Show" and has geared it for "... busy people ... people who may not have any interest in poetry at all." **A Writer's Almanac** will air Monday through Friday at 10:06 A.M.
