Writer Garrison Keillor brings radio show full circle

LIVINGSTON (AP) — Author and humorist Garrison Keillor says his weekly public radio program, now called "The American Radio Company," this fall will again be known as "A Prairie Home Companion."

"It's a name with a lot of tradition," Keillor said. He presided over the weekly variety show under its original name from 1974 to 1987 when the program originated from the New World Theater in St. Paul, Minn.
