On Monday, Nov. 30, Tarrant County becomes Lake Wobegon West as the Star-Telegram continues its 2009 author series with Garrison Keillor, acclaimed author, syndicated columnist and radio host. He'll bring his "whole show" to the Fort Worth/Arlington area, so be prepared for a special night of storytelling and more than a few audience sing-alongs!

Garrison Keillor has been one of America's most beloved entertainers for 32 years, ever since he hosted the first small-scale version of *A Prairie Home Companion* to an audience of about a dozen in a small St. Paul college theater. Now he's the toast of National Public Radio, and regularly sells out concert appearances around the country.

But he's an author, too, and comes to UTA on Nov. 30 to promote *A Christmas Blizzard*, his new holiday novella. It's classic Keillor yarn-spinning at its finest, and *A*

*Christmas Blizzard* is certain to continue its author's string of appearances on every bestseller list.

After his performance and a question-and-answer session with the audience, Garrison Keillor will conclude his program with a book signing. Copies of *A Christmas Blizzard* and selected Keillor backlist titles will be available for purchase on-site.

Though top tickets for Keillor concert performances often are \$250 or more, admission to this epic event is free – but reservations must be made in advance.
