Garrison Keillor fans have sometimes complained of the low level of publicity given his public appearances and radio tapings, and have been disappointed to learn, after the fact, of some marvelous happening he has concocted. Even without much publicity, Keillor has managed to attract packed houses by way of a grapevine of the Keillor faithful. Frequently the turnaway count matched the audience count.

This summer, however, the audiences at his live KSJN radio broadcasts have been far from capacity. So here's notice to Keillor fans who have been disappointed in the past: there are usually plenty of seats these summer Sat-
