

Old-time radio show to be on Viterbo stage

Garrison Keillor and the Powdermilk Biscuit Band will stage an old-time radio variety show at the Viterbo College Fine Arts Center at 8:15 p.m. Monday.

The show will be in the Recital Hall, with portions of it being taped for later broadcast on "A Prairie Home Companion," heard locally over KLSE (91.7 FM) every Saturday at 5:30 p.m., and on "A Prairie Home Morning Show," heard Tuesdays through Fridays from 6 to 9 a.m.

The show mixes humor, traditional music, fancy fiddling, guitar picking and old-time radio feeling. The show is usually taped in the St. Paul-Ramsey Arts and Science Center.

The road show includes regulars Dakota Dave Hull, Bob Douglas on mandolin and spoons and guitarist Adam Granger. Local talent also will be featured.

Keillor, host of "Prairie Home Companion" is a writer for "New Yorker" magazine in addition to his role as radio personality. Keillor's tales of Lake Wobegon, the mythical Jack's Auto Repair, and ("heavens, they're tasty!") Powdermilk Biscuits all lend to the nostalgia.

Tickets will be sold through the Viterbo box office and at the door. There will be no reserved seats.
