Keillor will spin tales of Lake Wobegon; and the band, with Fiddlin' Mary DuShane, guitarist Adam Granger, Bob Douglas on the mandolin and Dick Rees on bass, will play variety bluegrass, old-time, gospel and swing tunes. Ragtime pianist Butch Thompson will play, and join the band on clarinet.
