Radio show to visit La Crosse

Garrison Keillor and The Powdermilk Biscuit Band will stage a road show version of their weekly radio variety show, "A Prairie Home Companion," at 8:15 p.m., Thursday in the Viterbo College Fine Arts Center Main Theater. Keillor ("The Old Scout") is a teller of tales of Lake Wobegone, Minn., "the little town that time forgot" and its leading industries, Powdermilk Biscuits and Jack's Auto Repair. The band featuring, from left, Molly Mason on bass, guitarist Adam Granger, Bob Douglas on mandolin and spoons and Fiddlin' Mary DuShane, plays music ranging from jazz and traditional folk to bluegrass and swing. Jazz pianist and clarinetist Butch Thompson and Bill Staines, yodeler and singer, also will perform. The show is regularly broadcast at 6 p.m. Saturdays from the World Theater in St. Paul over the Minnesota Public Radio network — heard locally on KLSE 91.7 FM. Tickets are \$2.50 for adults, \$2 for students, seniors and members of Minnesota Public Radio and \$1 for children. They are available in advance from the Viterbo College Fine Arts Center box office.
