

Humorist Keillor heads UNI concert

CEDAR FALLS—A Prairie Home Companion, a variety show of folk music and humor featuring Garrison Keillor, will give a concert in the University of Northern Iowa Auditorium at 8 p.m. Oct. 10.

Keillor, as humorist and host for the performance, will provide reports from the mythical community of Lake Wobegon, Minn., "the little town that time forgot, that decades cannot improve," and commercials for the town's leading industries, Jack's Auto Repair—"all tracks lead to Jack's"—and Powdermilk Biscuits—"made from whole wheat grown by Norwegian bachelor farmers, so you know they are not only good, but also pure."

Musicians joining Keillor for the concert will include jazz pianist Butch Thompson, Stevie Beck, singer/songwriter Pop Wagner, and Greg Brown. Cedar Falls folksingers Scott Cawelti and Bob Waller also will perform.

A Prairie Home Companion is a weekly live radio show produced by Minnesota Public Radio in St. Paul. The broadcast is heard in eastern Iowa on public radio station KUNI-FM 91 each Saturday at 5 p.m.
