

'Prairie' to air from Baton Rouge

KDAQ's old-fashioned variety show, *A Prairie Home Companion*, will be broadcast live from Baton Rouge Saturday.

KDAQ, 89.9 FM, carries the national show Saturday afternoon at 5 p.m.

Garrison Keillor emcees this show, which is based in the World Theater in St. Paul, Minn. Two-hundred sixty American Public Radio affiliates nationwide carry the show, which has more than 2 million listeners.

The Baton Rouge performance will include special guests Beausoleil, Marc and Ann Savoy, Willie Humphrey and Frank Fields, along with the road show band including Chet Atkins, Johnny Gimble, Butch Thompson and Peter Ostroushko.

Beausoleil is one of Louisiana's top Cajun bands. This will be the band's third performance on *A Prairie Home Companion*. Marc and Ann Savoy of Eunice, also play traditional Cajun music. Frank Fields and Willie Humphrey will bring the sounds of New Orleans jazz from Preservation Hall.
