Garrison Keillor will bring his "The Story of Guys" to the Kentucky Center for the Arts on Nov. 3. "Men are in trouble," Keillor says. "It's time for women to take over the world so that guys can pursue their destiny as adventurers, lovers, humorists and backup singers." His show is composed of songs, poems and stories about men.

Keillor's longtime "Prairie Home Companion" sidekicks, Kate MacKenzie and pianist Richard Dworsky, will join him in the tribute, which also coincides with the publication of his new book, "The Book of Guys."

Keillor says that manhood peaked in the 18th century and that people have been treating it as a problem to be solved ever since. He promises to be a stand-up guy for guys everywhere.
